Welcome and Announcements Prelude

The Call to Worship

O Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you; I will praise your name, for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure.

For you have been a stronghold to the poor, a stronghold to the needy in his distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat:

Easter begins in despair. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday overshadow us. Where are the promises? Our life, our love, our hope forever dead.

Who will roll away the stone?

Easter takes us by surprise, early in the morning. The obstacles we expect to face are removed. Where once there was death and despair with no escape, now the bright light of hope brings freedom.

Where will we find him?

When faced by a miracle, our first reflex is to run. Be not afraid.

You seek Jesus of Nazareth who was crucified. He is risen: he is not here: see the place where they laid him. But go your way. Tell his disciples and Peter that he goes before you into Galilee. There you shall see him.

Suddenly the realization dawns. It may rise as quickly as the sun creeping over the horizon, or it may explode like fireworks, painting the world with dazzle. We recognize the One who was dead as he returns, brimming with life. Christ is risen, risen indeed!

Alleluia. And all who encounter Jesus, risen, whether gently roused by the sunrise or surprised by a sudden burst of joy, will join the Resurrection Procession one by one, slipping into step. Some of us singing, some of us silently soaking it in, some feeling like dancing, some rising from our knees in awe.

Brothers and Sisters. Christ is Risen!

Alleluia! Christ is risen indeed.

The Invitation

Lift up your hearts! We lift them up to the Lord! Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give God thanks and praise.

The Great Thanksgiving

It is right, O Lord our God, to give you thanks in all times, places and circumstances, for all your many gifts and blessings to us. But most of all we praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. He lived among us as a man, demonstrated your love to our broken and fractured world, died for us, the undeserved, death of a criminal, that our sins might be forgiven. Dying, he destroyed death, and by his resurrection won eternal life for us, and for all that dwell in him. Therefore, we join with angels, and archangels, and all the company of heaven, who forever proclaim your glory, saying:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he, who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest, Hosanna to the Lord!

The Commemoration

On the night in which our Lord was betrayed, he sat at the table with his friends. Breaking bread, he said: "Take and eat. This is my body which is broken for you. As often as you share it together, do it in remembrance of me."

When the meal was finished, he poured a cup, blessed it and said: "Drink this all of you. This is my blood which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sin. As often as you share it, do so in remembrance of me."

The Consecration

Bless now these gifts of bread and wine, elements chosen from our common life. Pour out your Holy Spirit upon them, and upon us removing them from all common and ordinary use, letting them be, when received in faith, the body and blood of Christ, food for the journey on which he is both guide and goal. By that same Spirit, fill our minds and hearts with

desire to offer our lives in service to you. Amen.

Thus we proclaim the core of our faith: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again. These are the gifts of God. Receive them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The Communion

We invite to the Table all who recognize Christ as Lord, regardless of denominational affiliation or lack thereof. Today we will receive the elements seated in our pews. Please wait until each element is distributed. We will consume the bread and the cup together. The cup is grape juice. Please keep silence until the prayer.

The Closing Thanksgiving

Thank you, O God, for feeding us with spiritual food in this sacrament of life. Send us now into the world with strength, hope, courage and love to serve you with gladness of heart through Jesus Christ: our Lord, our Savior and our Brother. Amen
