# Council Highlights.

**Communion procedures**. We will revert to our prepandemic process that uses two trays each of bread and juice. The juice trays will revert to wine in the outer ring and grape juice in the inner ring. To retain the coherency of the meal we will hold both elements (the juice will be passed first, and you can put the cups in the pew holders until we partake of them) and consume them in sequence after all are served both elements.

Additional Fire Extinguishers. We will procure two additional fire extinguishers to ensure that there is one close at hand at each location within the church.

**Electrical system review.** We will retain an electrician to (1) examine present wiring, (2) install additional circuits in the vestry, kitchen and sanctuary and (3) expand our current CMP service. As well, we continue to plan for permanently locating a portable backup generator in the new covered porch area (outside the food bank) and hardwire it into the church distribution system. The generator would be hooked directly to our propane supply so that we could run it without having to refill its gasoline tank regularly. The generator will be sized to power the kitchen/food bank freezers and refrigerators, plus the furnace and lighting, allowing us to have all church activities even if the CMP supply is out.

April Budgeted Mission - A Christian Ministry in the National Parks

ACMNP is a grassroots, student-led ministry that began in Yellowstone National Park in 1951 with the dream of providing Christian community for the people working in, living in, and visiting the first national park in the world.

Since then — for more than 70 years — ACMNP has given a Christian interpretation to the awe and grandeur of God's creation in the nation's national parks. ACMNP has always been a ministry in, rather than to, the national parks, serving employees, residents, and visitors through interdenominational worship services on Sundays.

Today, ACMNP lives its mission by sending roughly 150-200 ministry team members into 75 locations in 45 national parks from Alaska to the Virgin Islands. Over 30,000 people worship together in ACMNP services every year, experiencing the glory of God by seeing it first-hand — nothing compares to the inspiration that comes from worshipping God the Creator in the beautiful outdoors!

Although this mission is supported by CCES via the budget, if you wish to provide an additionally offering for it, just do so either noting on your check that it is for the monthly mission, or placing it in one of the mission offering envelopes in the card holders in the pews.

<u>March Budgeted Mission – One Great Hour of Sharing</u>. We just sent the funds for OGHS to the NACCC for distribution. This year the mission is aid to Palestinians and Israelis who have been impacted by the October 7<sup>th</sup> attacks in Israel and the subsequent war in Gaza. The principle conduit for NACCC aid to the area is the same partner working with the NACCC in Ukraine – Convoy of Hope. The budgeted amount was \$400 and we sent \$450 since a congregant gave an additional \$50 for this effort.
